Empowering Women to be Leaders

Menu of topics:

- 1. Are Women Their Worst Enemies?
 Feelings of fear, inferiority and disadvantage can significantly impede our ability to grow. This session will help to clear the perceptions that limit our perspective.
- 2. Visibility
 In the workplace where there are many employees, having high visibility can reap both visible and invisible benefits. This session covers the advantages of being a team member with high visibility and provides women with a roadmap of how to get there.
- Accountability
 It can be human nature to make excuses, justifications or even blame others instead of looking within to see where we can be accountable. Accountability inspires change but it is a choice that women need to make in order to be seen as leaders.
- 4. What's Stopping You? Getting Unstuck.

 Women face unique challenges in the workplace that can sometimes make them feel powerless. We'll you're your team to look within in order to determine what is stopping them and then provide them with the communication tools they need to get unstuck.
